### 2021 CAROLINA HURRICANES DRAFT GUIDE

**Round 1: Friday, July 23 – 8 P.M. ET (ESPN2)**

Hurricanes pick: 27th overall

**Rounds 2-7: Saturday, July 24 – 11 A.M. ET (NHL Network)**

Hurricanes picks: Round 2: 59th overall; Round 3: 91st overall, 94th overall (from VGK via DET); Round 4: 123rd overall; Round 6: 187th overall; Round 7: 200th overall (from LAK), 209th overall (from STL), 219th overall



The Carolina Hurricanes hold nine picks in the 2021 NHL Draft. The first round of the NHL Draft begins on Friday, July 23 and will be televised on ESPN2 at 8 p.m. ET. Rounds 2-7 will take place on Saturday, July 24 at 11 a.m. ET and will be televised on NHL Network. The Hurricanes made eight selections in the 2020 NHL Draft, including 13th-overall pick Seth Jarvis.

#### HURRICANES DRAFT NOTES

**History of the 27th Pick** – Carolina’s first selection in the 2021 NHL Draft will be 27th overall in the first round. Notable NHL players drafted 27th overall include John Carlson (WSH, 2008), Scott Gomez (NJD, 1998), Tie Domi (TOR, 1988), Joe Nieuwendyk (CGY, 1985) and Scott Mellanby (PHI, 1984). Hartford/Carolina has drafted 27th overall once, selecting Philippe Paradis from Shawinigan (QMJHL) in 2009.

**Making Moves** – The following deals impacted which selections Carolina will make in the 2021 NHL Draft:

- June 27, 2019: The Hurricanes traded their fifth-round pick in the 2021 NHL Draft (155th overall) and Nicolas Roy to the Golden Knights in exchange for Erik Haula.
- Sept. 24, 2019: The Hurricanes acquired Joel Edmundson, Dominik Bokk and St. Louis’ seventh-round pick in the 2021 NHL Draft (209th overall) from the Blues in exchange for Justin Faulk and Carolina’s fifth-round pick in the 2020 NHL Draft (Pavel Novak).
- Oct. 7, 2020: The Hurricanes acquired Los Angeles’ sixth-round selection in the 2020 NHL Draft (Lucas Mercuri) and Los Angeles’ seventh-round pick in the 2021 NHL Draft (200th overall) from the Kings in exchange for Montreal’s fifth-round pick in the 2020 NHL Draft (Ben Meehan).
- July 22, 2021: The Hurricanes acquired Jonathan Bernier and Vegas’ third-round selection in the 2021 NHL Draft (94th overall) from the Red Wings in exchange for Alex Nedeljkovic.

**Late Start** – The Hurricanes will make their first selection in the 2021 NHL Draft at 27th overall, which is tied for the sixth-latest first pick in franchise history. The five later first selections were:

- 2006 NHL Draft: 63rd overall (second round), Carolina selected Jamie McBain from the U.S. National Under-18 Team.
- 2012 NHL Draft: 38th overall (second round), Carolina selected Phil Di Giuseppe from the University of Michigan (CCHA).
- 1996 NHL Draft: 34th overall (second round), Hartford selected Trevor Wasylyuk from Medicine Hat (WHL).
- 2000 NHL Draft: 32nd overall (second round), Carolina selected Tomas Kurka from Plymouth (OHL).
- 2019 NHL Draft: 28th overall (first round), Carolina selected Ryan Suzuki from Barrie (OHL).

**Historically Speaking** – The following players are the NHL career scoring leaders at each selection that the Hurricanes hold entering this year's draft:

- 27th – Joe Nieuwendyk (CGY, 1985), 1126 points (564g, 562a)
- 59th – Michael Nylander (HFD, 1991), 679 points (209g, 470a)
- 91st – Marc Savard (NYR, 1995), 706 points (207g, 499a)
- 94th – Chris Kelly (OTT, 1999), 291 points (123g, 168a)
- 123rd – Craig Conroy (MTL, 1990), 542 points (182g, 360a)
- 187th – Mark Osiecki (CGY, 1987), 14 points (3g, 11a)
- 200th – Sergei Kostitsyn (MTL, 2005), 176 points (67g, 109a)
- 209th – Scott Wilson (PIT, 2011), 51 points (20g, 31a)
- 219th – Mike Grier (STL, 1993), 383 points (162g, 221a)

**Triple Sevens** – Carolina holds three picks in the seventh round (200, 209 and 219), and they are looking to make three seventh-round selections in one draft for the first time in franchise history. The Hurricanes have previously made three picks in a round four times:

- 2016 NHL Draft, Third Round – Matt Filipe (67th), Hudson Elynuik (74th) and Jack LaFontaine (75th)
- 2012 NHL Draft, Fourth Round – Erik Karlsson (99th), Trevor Carrick (115th) and Jaccob Slavin (120th)
- 2003 NHL Draft, Fourth Round – Aaron Dawson (102nd), Kevin Nastiuk (126th) and Matej Trojovský (130th)
- 1998 NHL Draft, Fourth Round – Josef Vasicek (91st), Tommy Westlund (93rd) and Chris Madden (97th)

**Homegrown** – 12 of the 31 players (38.7%) who appeared in at least one game for the Hurricanes during the 2020-21 regular season were drafted and developed by Carolina. Those 12 players accounted for 48.6% of the team's goals (85), 51.6% of the team's assists (159) and 50.5% of the team's points (244).

**Roaring 20** – Sebastian Aho (35th overall, 2015) led the Hurricanes in goals (24), assists (33) and points (57) in 2020-21, becoming the first player to accomplish the feat since Eric Staal in 2011-12. He also joined Staal as the second player since relocation to tally at least a point per game in multiple seasons (30-53—83 in 2018-19). Aho ranked first on the team in shorthanded goals (3) and tied for first in power-play goals (7), becoming one of five NHL players to lead their team in both categories in 2020-21 and one of three players to score at least three goals while shorthanded and on the power play. He also recorded a team-high 11 points (6g, 5a) during the playoffs, including the series-clinching overtime goal in Game 6 of the First Round at Nashville on May 27.

**Sveching Fire** – Andrei Svechnikov (2nd overall, 2018) ranked fifth on the team in goals (15) and third in assists (27) and points (42) during the regular season. His 140 career points (59g, 81a) lead the 2018 NHL Draft class, and he ranks second on the team in goals since joining the Hurricanes in 2018-19. Svechnikov also recorded eight points (2g, 6a) during the playoffs, including a team-high six assists and a team-long, four-game point streak from May 30 to June 5 (1-4—5).

**Naughty by Necas** – Martin Necas (12th overall, 2017) tallied 41 points (14g, 27a) in 2020-21, becoming just the fifth different Czech-born player in franchise history to post 40 points in a single season. He scored the first two shorthanded goals and the first two overtime goals of his NHL/Hurricanes career, ranking tied for eighth and tied for fourth in the NHL in those respective categories. He also scored his first career shootout game-deciding goal at Florida on Feb. 27 before being named the NHL's Third Star of the Week on March 8 and Second Star of the Week on March 29. Necas registered five points (2g, 3a) in 11 playoff games, including his first career postseason multi-goal game vs. Nashville in Game 5 of the First Round on May 25.

**Behavin' Slavin** – Jacob Slavin (120th overall, 2012) was named the winner of the 2020-21 Lady Byng Memorial Trophy, given to the player who best combines sportsmanship and gentlemanly play with high-level playing ability. He earned 15 points (3g, 12a) in 52 games and was assessed just two penalty minutes despite averaging a team-high 22:59 of ice time per game. Slavin also registered six points (1g, 5a) in eight playoff games and passed Dave Babych and Bret Hedican for the most playoff assists by a defenseman in franchise history (17).

**Bean Machine** – Jake Bean (13th overall, 2016) completed his first full NHL season in 2020-21, registering 12 points (1g, 11a) in 42 games during the regular season. He ranked tied for third in points and tied for second in assists among NHL rookie defensemen. Bean earned his first career NHL/Hurricanes point (assist) vs. Columbus on Feb. 15 and scored his first career NHL/Hurricanes goal at Florida on Feb. 27. He also scored a power-play goal in Game 1 of the Second Round vs. Tampa Bay on May 30, becoming just the third rookie defenseman in franchise history and the first since relocation to score a playoff goal.

**Stevie Wonder** – Steven Lorentz (186th overall, 2015) posted eight points (2g, 6a) in 45 games during his first NHL season in 2020-21, making his NHL/Hurricanes debut against Tampa Bay on Jan. 28. With an assist against Dallas on Jan. 30, he became the 10th player drafted by Hartford/Carolina with the 186th overall pick or later to earn a point with the franchise, and the first since Manny Legace (188th overall, 1993) on Dec. 18, 2009. At Nashville on March 2, he became the sixth such player to score a goal with the franchise, and the first since Craig Adams (223rd overall, 1996) on Jan. 10, 2008. Lorentz also tallied three assists in 11 playoff games, making his NHL/Hurricanes playoff debut in Game 1 of the First Round against Nashville on May 17 and joining Jaroslav Svoboda (208th overall, 1998) as the second such player to record a postseason point with Hartford/Carolina.

**Hungry Like the Wolf** – Carolina's AHL affiliate, the Chicago Wolves, captured the Sam Pollock Trophy as Central Division champions after posting a 20-8-1-2 record during the regular season. Four Hurricanes' draft picks made their AHL debuts with the Wolves: David Cotton (169th overall, 2015), Seth Jarvis (13th overall, 2020), Jamieson Rees (44th overall, 2019) and Ryan Suzuki (28th overall, 2019). Cotton ranked tied for second in goals (14) and tied for third in power-play goals (5) among AHL rookies.

**Revenge of the Seth** – Seth Jarvis (13th overall, 2020) split the 2020-21 season between Chicago (AHL) and Portland (WHL). He began the season by tallying 11 points (7g, 4a) with the Wolves through nine AHL games, including goals in five of his first six professional contests. He was leading the AHL in points when he was assigned to Portland on March 2. Jarvis then posted 27 points (15g, 12a) in 24 WHL games, including two hat tricks, to help Portland to a 13-8-3 record.

**Jackpot** – Jack LaFontaine (65th overall, 2016) posted a 22-7-0 record, 1.79 goals-against average, .934 save percentage and five shutouts in 29 NCAA games during his fourth collegiate season and his second at Minnesota. He led all Division I goaltenders in wins and ranked tied for second in save percentage and shutouts and fourth in goals-against average as he led the Golden Gophers to a Big Ten Tournament championship. LaFontaine won the Mike Richter Award as the top goaltender in Division I, and he was also named Big Ten Goaltender of the Year, Big Ten Tournament Most Outstanding Player, a First-Team All-American and a top-10 finalist for the Hobey Baker Award.

**Center of Attention** – Jack Drury (42nd overall, 2018) recorded 30 points (10g, 20a) in 41 games with Vaxjo Lakers (SHL) during his first professional season. He also ranked second in the league with 11 playoff points (5g, 6a) in 14 games to help Vaxjo win its third Le Mat Trophy as SHL champions. Drury scored two goals in the championship-deciding game, including his first professional game-winning goal. He also represented the United States at the 2021 IIHF World Championship, scoring two goals in nine games as the team won a bronze medal.

**Russian Around** – Vasily Ponomarev (53rd overall, 2020) posted 38 points (10g, 28a) in 33 QMJHL games with Shawinigan in 2020-21. Named an alternate captain for the Cataractes before the start of the season, he ranked fourth on his team in goals, with a league-high six game-winners. Ponomarev also won 59.6% of his faceoffs, marking the third-highest faceoff win percentage among all QMJHL centers (min. 30 draws). He also represented Russia at the 2021 IIHF World Junior Championship, scoring a team-high three goals in seven games.

**Flying Colors** – While Jack Drury (42nd overall, 2018) won a bronze medal with the United States at the 2021 IIHF World Championship, his fellow Hurricanes' 2018 draft pick Jesper Sellgren (166th overall, 2018) posted one assist in four games with Sweden. Additionally, three Hurricanes' draft picks represented their countries at the 2021 IIHF World Junior Championship alongside Vasily Ponomarev of Russia: Noel Gunler (41st overall, 2020), Zion Nybeck (115th overall, 2020) and Ryan Suzuki (28th overall, 2019). Gunler (4-1—5) and Nybeck (0-1—1) represented Sweden, with Gunler leading the team in goals and tying for the team lead in points at the tournament. Suzuki tallied four points (2g, 2a) to help Canada earn a silver medal.

**Draft Day Deals**— The Hurricanes have made 21 deals on draft day in franchise history, including 19 since relocating to Carolina:

- **Oct. 7, 2020 (Virtual):** Hurricanes acquired a sixth-round pick in the 2020 NHL Draft (Lucas Mercuri) and a seventh-round pick in the 2021 NHL Draft from Los Angeles in exchange for a fifth-round pick in the 2020 NHL Draft (Ben Meehan).
- **June 22, 2019 (Vancouver, B.C.):** Hurricanes acquired a top-10 protected first-round pick in the 2020 NHL Draft (Seth Jarvis), a seventh-round pick in the 2020 NHL Draft (Alexander Pashin) and forward Patrick Marleau from Toronto in exchange for a sixth-round pick in the 2020 NHL Draft (Axel Rindell).
- **June 22, 2019 (Vancouver, B.C.):** Hurricanes acquired a second-round pick in the 2019 NHL Draft (Jamieson Rees) and a third-round pick in the 2019 NHL Draft (Anttoni Honka) from Ottawa in exchange for a second-round pick in the 2019 NHL Draft (Mads Sogaard).
- **June 22, 2019 (Vancouver, B.C.):** Hurricanes acquired a third-round pick in the 2019 NHL Draft (Patrik Puustola) and a fourth-round pick in the 2019 NHL Draft (Cade Webber) from Minnesota in exchange for a second-round pick in the 2019 NHL Draft (Hunter Jones).
- **June 23, 2018 (Dallas, Texas):** Hurricanes acquired defenseman Dougie Hamilton, forward Micheal Ferland and the rights to defenseman Adam Fox from Calgary in exchange for defenseman Noah Hanifin and forward Elias Lindholm.
- **June 23, 2018 (Dallas, Texas):** Hurricanes acquired Boston's 2019 seventh-round pick from the NY Rangers in exchange for Vegas' 2018 seventh-round pick (Riley Hughes).
- **June 27, 2015 (Sunrise, Fla.):** Hurricanes acquired goaltender Eddie Lack from Vancouver in exchange for Carolina's third-round pick in 2015 (Guillaume Brisebois) and seventh-round pick in 2016 (Brett McKenzie).
- **June 27, 2015 (Sunrise, Fla.):** Hurricanes acquired defenseman James Wisniewski from Anaheim in exchange for goaltender Anton Khudobin.
- **June 30, 2013 (Newark, N.J.):** Hurricanes acquired defenseman Andrej Sekera from Buffalo in exchange for a 2013 second-round pick (JT Compher) and defenseman Jamie McBain.
- **June 22, 2012 (Pittsburgh, Pa.):** Hurricanes acquired forward Jordan Staal from Pittsburgh in exchange for forward Brandon Sutter, defenseman Brian Dumoulin and Carolina's 2012 first-round (eighth overall) draft pick (Derrick Pouliot).
- **June 26, 2010 (Los Angeles, Calif.):** Hurricanes acquired forward Jonathan Matsumoto from Philadelphia in exchange for Washington's 2010 seventh-round pick (Ricard Blidstrand).
- **June 26, 2010 (Los Angeles, Calif.):** Hurricanes acquired forward Riley Nash from Edmonton in exchange for Ottawa's 2010 second-round pick (Martin Marincin).

- **June 26, 2004 (Raleigh, N.C.):** Hurricanes acquired the fourth overall pick in the first round of the 2004 NHL Entry Draft (Andrew Ladd) from Columbus in exchange for the eighth overall pick in the first round (Alexandre Picard) and a second-round pick (Kyle Wharton).
- **June 22, 2003 (Nashville, Tenn.):** Hurricanes acquired forward Marty Murray from Philadelphia in exchange for a sixth-round pick in the 2004 NHL Entry Draft (Frederik Cabana).
- **June 21, 2003 (Nashville, Tenn.):** Hurricanes acquired defenseman Danny Markov and a third-round pick in the 2005 NHL Entry Draft (traded to NSH – Teemu Laakso) from Phoenix in exchange for David Tanabe and Igor Knyazevs.
- **June 24, 2001 (Sunrise, Fla.):** Hurricanes acquired forward Chris Dingman from Colorado in exchange for a 2001 fifth-round draft pick (Mikko Vitanen).
