The Avalanche franchise owns a 23-11-7 (.646) all-time record on Opening Night, the second-best mark in the NHL (min 10 games).

HOME SWEET HOME

The Avalanche/Nordiques are 28-9-4 (.732) all-time in home openers, the second-best mark of any team (min 10 GP) behind only Minnesota (14-2-4, .800) ... Colorado is 16-6-3 (.700) in home openers since moving to Denver, which includes a 14-5-2 (.714) mark at Ball Arena.

HOME BODIES

The Avs will begin their season at home for the fourth straight year, the 13th time in the last 16 seasons and for the 15th time in the last 19.

AVS & BLACKHAWKS

Colorado is facing Chicago on Opening Night for the third time since relocating to Denver (also 2003-04 and 2010-11, both at Ball Arena) ... The Avs won both of those openers, 5-0 on Oct. 10, 2003 and 4-3 in overtime on Oct. 7, 2010 ... This is the first of four meetings between Colorado and Chicago in 2021-22 and the first of two at Ball Arena ... They will meet up three times in January to close out the season series.

The Avalanche will return to the Central Division in 2021-22 after competing in the Honda West Division last season ... With the expansion Seattle Kraken beginning play this year and joining the Pacific Division, the Central will now have eight teams with the addition of the Arizona Coyotes ... The Avs will play 26 games against their division foes, meeting Arizona, Chicago, Minnesota, Nashville and Winnipeg four times each (two home/away) and Dallas (one home/two away) and St. Louis (two home/one away) three times apiece ... Colorado will play 24 games versus the Pacific Division (three times each) and 32 against teams from the Eastern Conference (one home/away).

CHINA BOUND

Two Avalanche players have been named to their respective national teams for the 2022 Olympics in Beijing, Gabriel Landeskog (Sweden) and Mikko Rantanen (Finland) ... Landeskog will be making his second appearance at the Olympics after helping Sweden capture the silver medal as the youngest member of his national team (21 years old) at Sochi, Russia, in 2014 ... Rantanen will be making his Olympic debut.

MILE HIGH MAINSTAYS

Erik Johnson is entering his 14th NHL season and 12th with the Avalanche ... His 12 seasons rank fourth in franchise history behind only Joe Sakic (20), Adam Foote (17) and Milan Hejduk (14) ... Johnson and Foote are the only defensemen to appear in 12 or more seasons with Colorado/Quebec ... Johnson is the longest current tenured athlete of any of Denver's four major sports teams.

AVS WIN PRESIDENTS' TROPHY, DIVISION TITLE

The Avalanche finished the 2020-21 season with a 39-13-4 record (82 points), winning the Honda West Division and Presidents' Trophy ... Colorado finished with its highest points percentage in franchise history (.732), breaking the previous mark of .720 set in 2000-01 ... The Avs claimed their third Presidents' Trophy (1996-97, 2000-01) and 10th division title since moving to Denver (12th in franchise history) ... The Avs overcame two COVID-related pauses, the only team to pause twice in 2020-21, and the second-most man-games lost to injury in the league with 313 ... The Avalanche earned a trip to the Stanley Cup Playoffs for the fourth straight year, the third-longest run in franchise history ... Quebec/Colorado made 11 straight trips to the postseason from 1995 to 2006 and the Nordiques made seven straight from 1981 to 1987.

AIN'T NO MOUNTAIN HIGH, AIN'T NO VALLEY LOW

Colorado's first overall finish in 2020-21 came just four years after finishing last overall in the standings in 2016-17 ... The Avs were the first NHL team to go from worst to first in four seasons or less since the Bruins in 1970-71 ... Boston finished last in the league just four years earlier in 1966-67.

NO PLACE LIKE HOME

The Avalanche finished last season 22-4-2 at home (.821), tied with Pittsburgh for the most wins and points (46) in the league ... The .821 home points percentage was the club's highest since relocating to Denver, topping the .768 by the 2000-01 squad ... The only season in franchise history with a better home mark was 1994-95 (.875 by Quebec) ... Colorado ended the season on a nine-game home winning streak and went 16-0-1 in its final 17 at Ball Arena, tying the franchise record for the longest home point streak (Jan. 20–Apr. 6, 2003, 14-0-2-1) ... The Avs out-scored their opponents 110-54 (+56) on home ice.

IN BEDSIE WE TRUST

Jared Bednar led the Avalanche to the Presidents' Trophy and Honda West Division championship during his fifth season behind the bench last year ... The 2020-21 Avalanche posted their highest points percentage in franchise history (.732), topping the 2000-01 team (.720), while Bednar's .732 winning percentage was by far the best of any Colorado/Quebec coach in a single season ... Bednar owns a 184-149-39 (.547) career record, which includes a 162-93-35 (.619) mark and four straight playoff appearances since the start of 2017-18 ... Bednar's 372 games coached are the most in Avalanche history (since 1995-96) and second in franchise history behind only Michel Bergeron (634) ... Bednar's 184 wins trail only Bergeron (265) and Bob Hartley (193) ... Hired on Aug. 25, 2016, Bednar is the fifth-longest tendered coach in the NHL behind Jon Cooper (March 25, 2013), Paul Maurice (Jan. 12, 2014), Jeff Blashill (June 9, 2015) and Mike Sullivan (Dec. 12, 2015).

GETTING IT DONE AT BOTH ENDS OF THE ICE

The Avs were the highest-scoring team in the NHL last season, potting 197 goals for an average of 3.52 per game ... It was the first time since relocating to Denver that the Avalanche led the league in goals ... The Nordiques finished first once, 1994-95 ... Colorado allowed the third-fewest goals against (132), yielding only 2.46 per night ... The Avs finished second in the NHL in goal differential at +64, the highest by an Avalanche team since 2000-01 (+78) ... Colorado out-scored the opposition by an average of 1.16 goals-per-game, a franchise record ... Avalanche netminders posted eight shutouts, second in the NHL and their most in a season 2009-10 (eight) ... Colorado was 33-2-3 when scoring three or more goals and 36-5-1 when allowing three or fewer (32-1-0 when allowing two or less).

HIT ME WITH YOUR BEST SHOT
